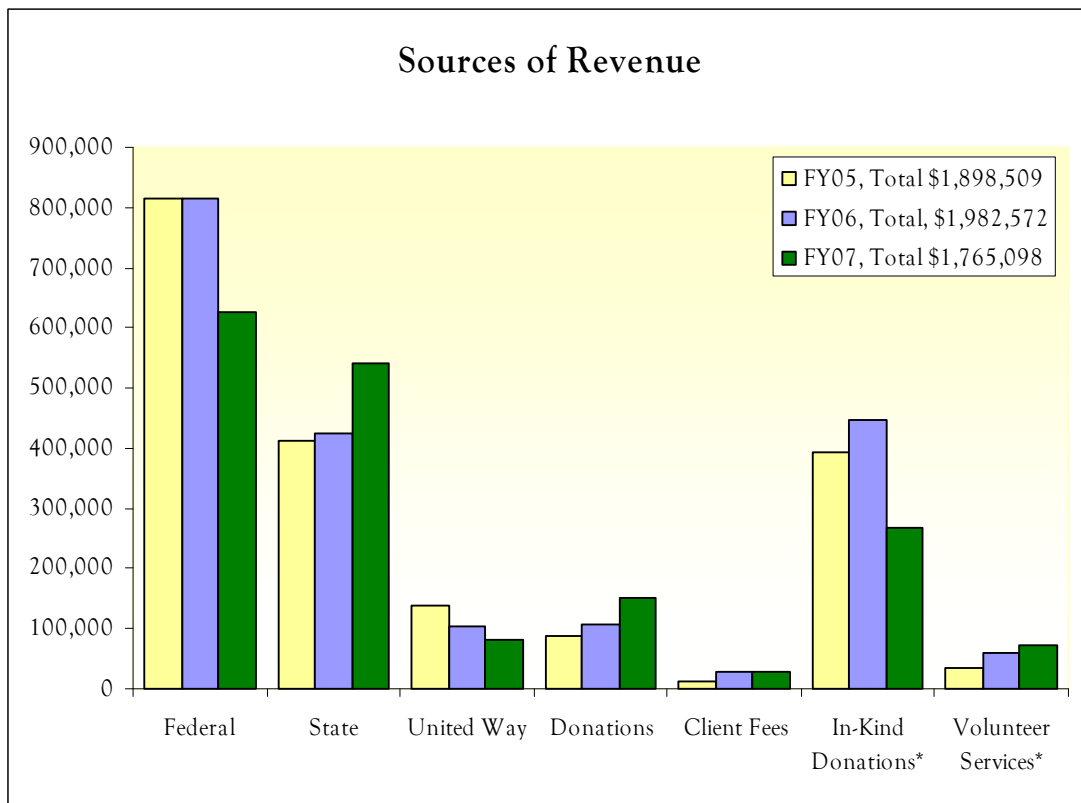

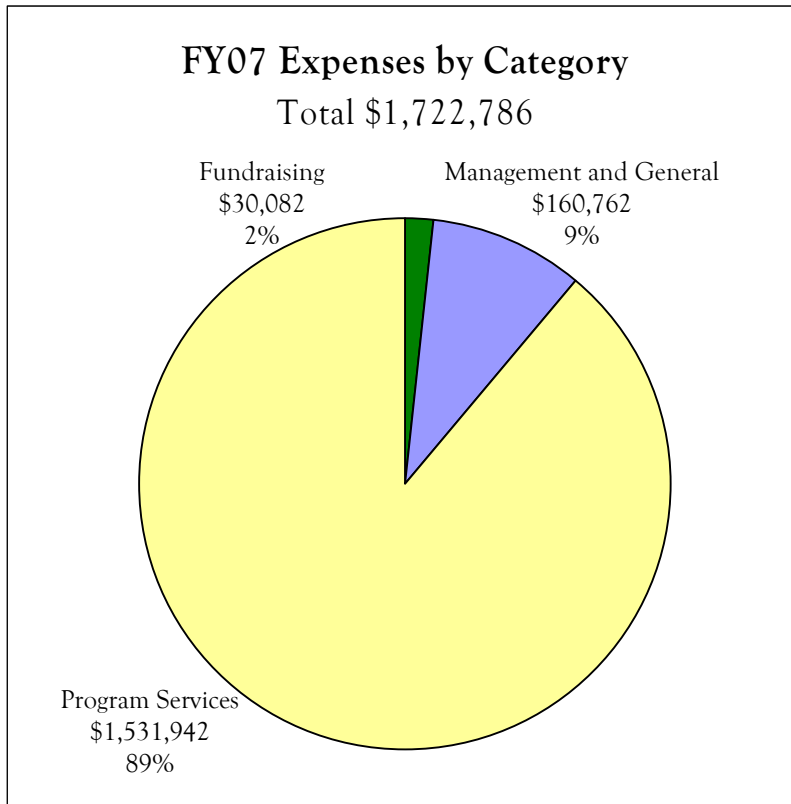

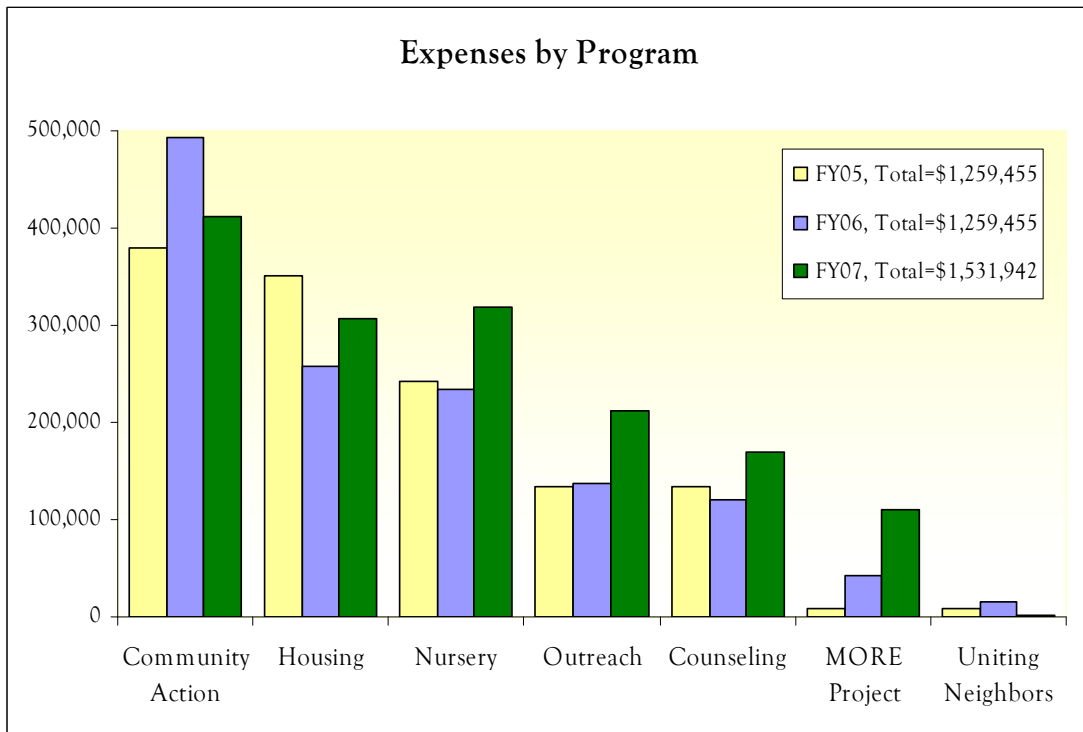

Expenses by Program

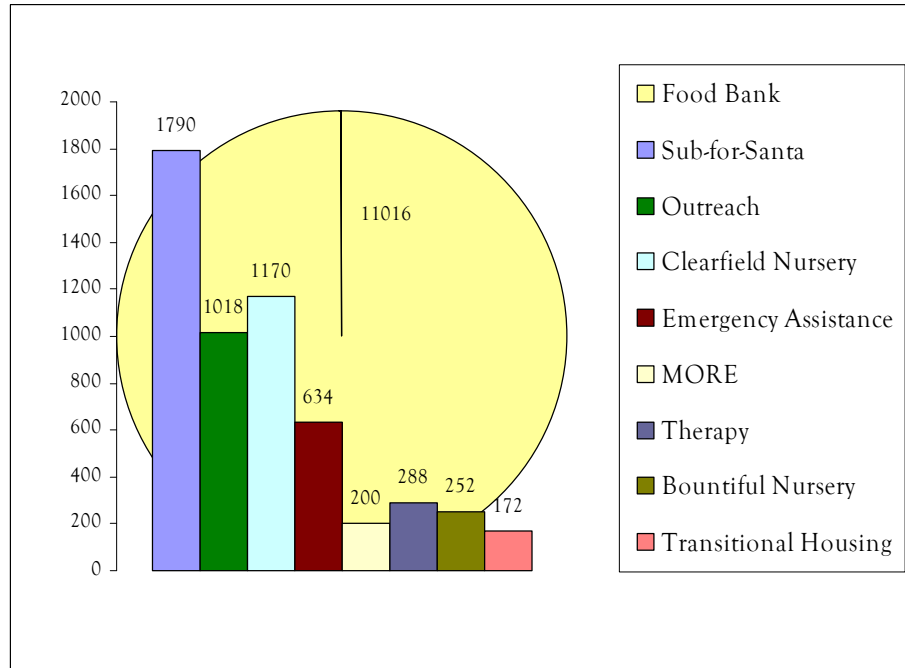

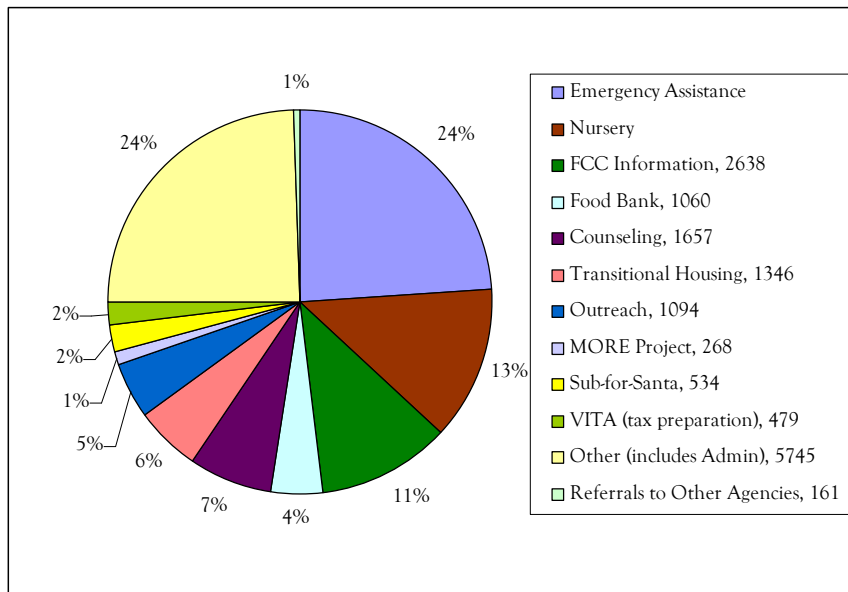
Total Served: 16,540

Telephone Information and Referral

23,731 calls for assistance were made to the Family Connection Center this year. Of those calls, 23,570 were directed to departments within the agency and 161 were referred to agencies outside of the Family Connection Center.



“Referrals to Other Agencies” includes: HEAT Program, Division of Workforce Services, Davis Affordable Housing, Catholic Community Services, Shelters, Red Cross, Community Mental Health, Medical, and Weatherization.

Nursery Department

Mission

Our mission is to prevent child abuse by providing a safe house for children ages 0 to 11 years, and by ensuring a positive, nurturing experience for every child who visits the crisis nursery.

Services

- Crisis Nursery—available to parents in crisis for up to 72 hours.
- Respite Nursery—provides 2 to 3 hour timeout breaks for parents to attend appointments, or whatever they choose to do.



Outcomes

Results of FRIENDS Outcome Evaluation Survey (July 2006 through June 2007)

Crisis Care:

- 97% of Clearfield and 95% of Bountiful clients reported some stress and trauma from their crisis was alleviated due to the availability of a safe house
- 79% of Clearfield and 82% of Bountiful clients reported their children would have been left in less desirable circumstances without these services

Respite Care

- 81% of Clearfield and 83% of Bountiful clients reported that their stress was greatly reduced
- 13% of Clearfield and 9% of Bountiful clients reported stress was slightly reduced

Outreach Department

Mission

The Outreach Education Program strengthens and stabilizes families by providing support, education and access to community resources.



Services

- In-home parent education
- Court ordered parent education
- Parents as Teachers (PAT) program
- Parenting classes

Infant Toddler Specialist

- Assess child care standards and provide training and education to centers participating in the State's Baby Steps Program
- Provide education about child development, adult interaction, safety and room arrangement

- Provide materials to each center (art supplies, children’s books, etc.)
- Provide training about child temperaments and childcare staff teamwork at State Conferences

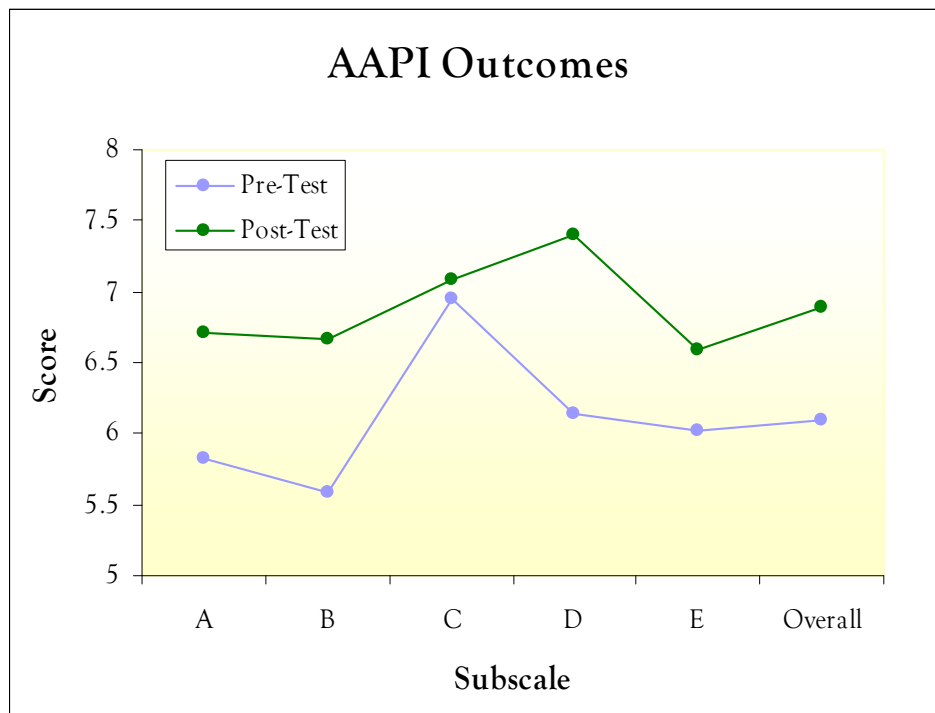
Outcomes

Clients served: 1,018. All parents take a Pre and Post Test called the Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI) to assess parenting skills on a 10 point scale.

AAPI Subscale Measures:

- A. Inappropriate expectations of children
- B. Parental lack of empathy toward children’s needs
- C. Strong belief in the use of corporal punishment as means of discipline
- D. Reversing parent-child role responsibilities
- E. Oppressing children’s power and independence.

The chart below illustrates improvement in parenting skills. Higher scores indicate more effective parenting skills.



Therapy Department

Mission

Our mission is to assist individuals and families to resolve the pain and suffering of physical, sexual and emotional abuse and trauma and to increase their resiliency, quality of life and relationship functioning.

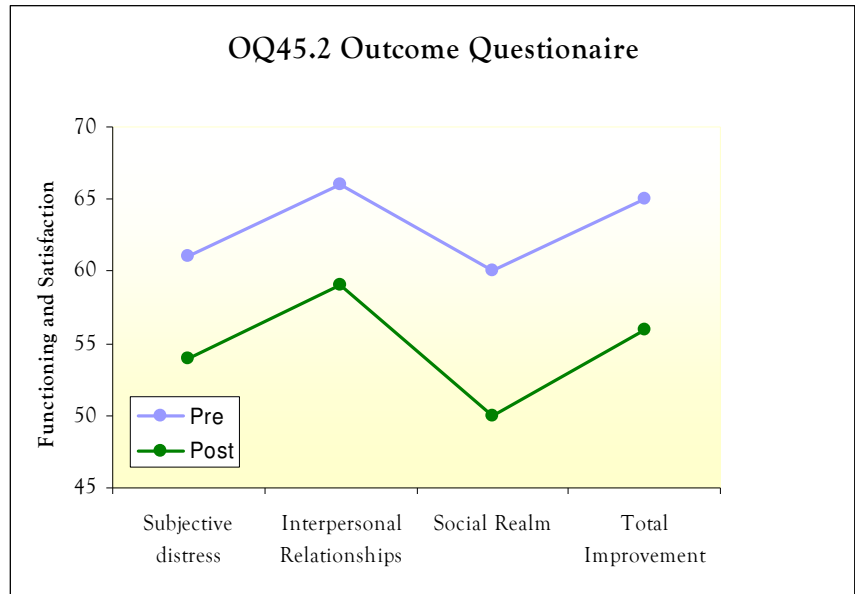
Counseling services are provided at a greatly reduced cost from most other not-for-profit organizations and private therapy providers in the county.

Services

- Individual therapy
- Sand tray therapy
- Family therapy
- STEP families classes
- Marriage counseling
- Anger Management classes
- Play therapy
- Marriage Preparation (PREP) classes
- Art therapy
- Neurofeedback Training

Outcomes

Clients served: 288. The therapy department uses the Outcome Questionnaire 45.2 to assess client functioning. A lower score indicates lower distress and improved satisfaction and functioning. Any score below 60 is considered a healthy level of functioning.”



Neurofeedback

Neurofeedback is a technique in which we train the brain to help improve its ability to regulate all bodily functions and to take care of itself. When the brain is not functioning well, evidence of this often shows up in the EEG (Electroencephalogram). By challenging the brain, much as you challenge your body in physical exercise, we can help your brain learn to function better.

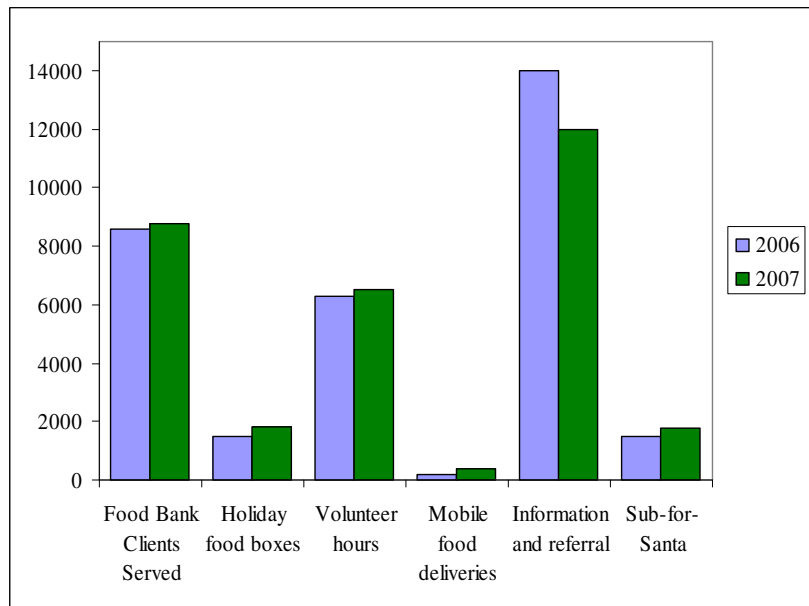

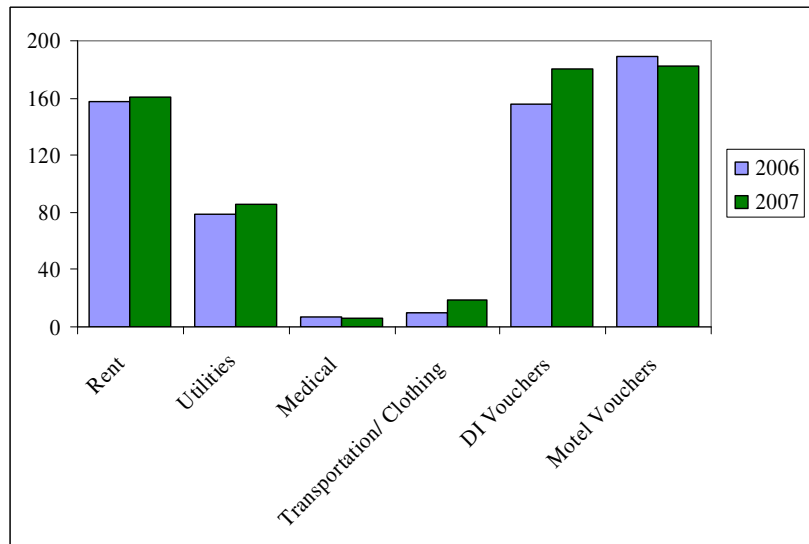

Through prevention, intervention and awareness, we will empower homeless families and individuals to take steps toward independent living.

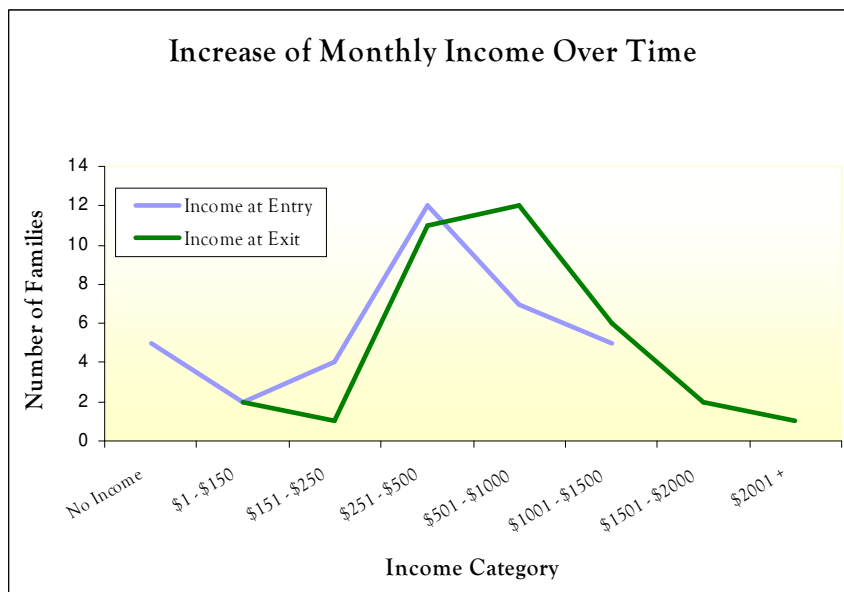
Services

Outcomes

Data from Yearly Report for HUD grant and Pilot Program

- 59 families (100%) moved into permanent housing
- 30 families (73%) resided in permanent supportive housing for over 6 months
- 35 (59%) heads of households obtained employment
- 34 (58%) heads of households completed at least 6 Life Skills Classes
- 11 (19%) heads of households obtained a certificate of completion in a school program with a positive job outlook
- Clients served: 172



The income at exit is shifted to the right indicating a significant increase of income from program entry to program exit, for all program participants whether they completed the program or not.

M.O.R.E. Program

Mission

The Member Organized Resource Exchange (MORE) program empowers people in the community to provide for their own needs by supporting one another in resource sharing and becoming self-determined.
